Generally, there are four major types of PCV licences that are settled as per the government guidelines. These are listed below for your reference. Also, all the requirements as well as the PCV licence cost for each category are mentioned in detail.

Category D1

The D1 category is for minibuses, and it permits you to drive one with between 9 and 16 passenger seats. A D1 licence allows drivers to operate vehicles up to 8 metres in length.

Category D1+E

Category D1 +E licence allows you to drive the minibuses with 9 to 26 passengers and can also tow a trailer weighing up to 750 kilograms.

Category B + E

In this type of licence, you can tow a trailer with a maximum approved mass of 750 kg to 3,500 kg while driving a passenger car. The vehicle carries a maximum of 8 passengers.

How to get a PCV Licence?

- 1. Initially, a person should be a minimum of 18 years to get the PCV licence.
- 2. Holding a full car licence.
- 3. Applying for the provisional entitlements on your licence.
- 4. Getting the medical test done as per the government guidelines.
- 5. Opting for Theory and the practical tests demonstrated by the government.
