Types of Driving Licences

AM Licence

The licence usually covers Mopeds and other two or three-wheel vehicles. Recently it is seen that as per the updates in this type of licence it is important to also include Light Quadricycles into it.

A1 Licence

With this, you can ride a light motorcycle having an engine size of 125 cc and a power output that is up to 11kw (14.6bhp).

A2 Licence

A2 licence can assist you to ride a motorcycle with a power output that should not generally exceed 35 kW and also additionally a power/weight ratio that should not exceed 0.2 kW/kg.

A Licence

It is generally a full motorcycle licence, which lets you ride bikes with power exceeding 35 kW.

B Licence

B licence is the licence that permits you to drive a motor vehicle having a maximum weight of 3,500kg.

B Auto Licence

Generally, it is seen that the Category B auto licence has almost similar conditions to that of the conditions category B licence. These category vehicles generally use an automatic transmission.

B+E Licence

This licence can allow you to drive a combination of a category B motor vehicle with a trailer or a semi-trailer.

C1 Licence

C1 licence allowing you to drive the vehicles that have a weight between 3,500 and 7,500kg which has an option of a trailer of weight that is almost equal to or more than 750 kg. The age limit for getting the licence for this type of vehicle is 18 years.

C1+E Licence

This is the licence that is assisting you to drive vehicles which are having a trailer that is over 750kg weight. Also in general terms, it is said that the combined weight of both should not be more than the 12,000kg weight.

C Licence

You can drive Heavy Goods Vehicles with a category C licence that is generally weighing over 3,500kg (with an additional trailer of up to 750kg).

C+E Licence

The C licence generally permits you to drive heavy and rigid vehicles (HGVs) with a trailer weighing more than 750kg.

D1 Licence

With this type of licence you can drive mini buses which are usually vehicles that do not have more than 16 passenger seats and are generally of the maximum length of 8 metres.

D1+E Licence

This entitlement licence lets you drive the Category D1 minibus with an additional trailer that weighs up to 750kg (this is the maximum weight).

D Licence

Category D licence usually assists you in driving any bus which can sustain more than 8 passenger seats, with an additional option for a trailer whose weight is equal to or less than 750kg.

D+ELicence

With this type of licence you can drive any bus or coach with a trailer weighing more than 750kg.

G Licence

G licence generally permits you to drive road rollers that can be even steam or diesel-driven.

F Licence

The licence lets you drive various agricultural tractors, but also these types of vehicles can also be driven on a category B licence.

K Licence

It is a **type of driving licence UK** that usually helps you to drive a ride-on mowing machine or even a pedestrian-controlled vehicle legally on public roads.

H Licence

This is the licence type that is used for civilian tracked vehicles and former military vehicles.
